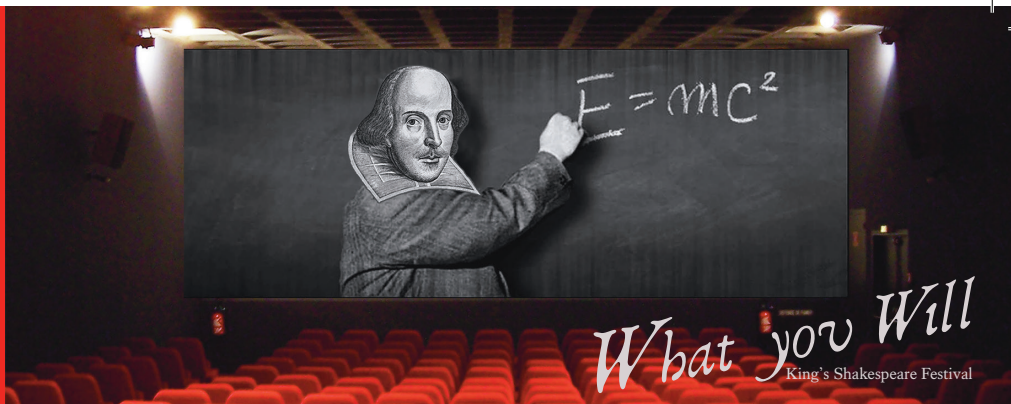

## In Nature's Mystery More Science...

As part of the **Shakespeare400** celebrations, the **Faculty of Natural and Mathematical Sciences** is organising the screening of two films that have been adapted from or inspired by two of Shakespeare's plays and that prominently feature scientific content.

In Tom Stoppard's *Rosencrantz and Guildenstern are Dead* the two eponymous minor characters from Hamlet stumble around unaware of their scripted lives and unable to deviate from them. *Dr John Armstrong* (Department of Mathematics) will discuss probability, chance and chaos in the lives of Hamlet's two childhood friends.
